As we conclude a national search for the next dean for BEACAHMPS, I would like to thank Dr. John Coliton for serving as the interim dean of BEACAHMPS and the chair of the search committee for the next BEACAHMPS dean. Dr. Coliton excelled at leading BEACAHMPS and brought a commitment to excellence and a sense of humor to his interim role. His dedication to the College and BEACAHMPS was exemplary, and I am grateful for his service.

I am pleased to announce that Mr. Alton Henley has accepted the position of dean BEACAHMPS and will begin his tenure on July 1, 2022. Mr. Henley was most recently the senior director, Information Technology Institute, Workforce Development and Continuing Education (WDCE) at Montgomery College. In his role as senior director, Mr. Henley mentored over 70 part-time faculty and staff and managed over 300 courses per year on behalf of WDCE. His successful tenure in WDCE has prepared him effectively to lead BEACAHMPS and foster cross-area and cross-division collaborations to address student and community stakeholder needs. Mr. Henley earned a bachelor of arts in liberal studies from Excelsior College in Albany, New York, and a master of business administration from Howard University in Washington, D.C.
