






Did you ever attend classes at Montgomery College?

What is a Facilities Master Plan?

Goal

- Required by the state every 10 years
- Establish a framework for the development of capital projects to support the role, mission, and academic vision of the College.
- Address key issues to support enrollment, define space needs, and new facilities initiatives.
- Address the relationship between the College and adjoining business and residential communities.



The Facilities Master Plan

The FMP will include recommendations and plans for:

- An evaluation of current facilities conditions and projected needs
- An overview of the College: mission, vision, values; interrelationships among institutional units; institutional performance; internal and external factors; and anticipated changes
- An implementation strategy with project phasing by each campus location based on a need to accommodate people and/or modernize or replace facilities for services or programs

The Facilities Master Plan | S:


- A conceptual, high-level document
- A summary of existing conditions of the facilities
- A concept of future facility needs

The Facilities Master Plan IS NOT:

- A development plan
- A design for a building
- A construction document

Facilities Master Plan 2013-2023 Plan







Initial Observations

Takoma Park/ Silver Spring

- Takoma Park located in residential neighborhoods and adjacent to historic district
- Silver Spring highly visible in urban setting
- Existing MOU provides guidance regarding campus development
- Bifurcated by rail / city line
- Primarily structured parking
- Limited recreation / athletics
- Original Takoma Park buildings inefficient
- 10 30 min. from I-495
- Proximate to several transit means


