FALL 2024 OFFICIAL ENROLLMENT OVERVIEW

- **❖** There are 18,835 credit students in Fall 2024 by census date.
 - **3,718** or **19.7%** are first-time-ever-in-college (FTEIC) students. This is an increase of 152 students, or +4.3%, compared to Fall 2023.
 - 1,031 or 5.5% transferred from other colleges.
 - 11,734 or 62.3% are returning students. There are 2,280 FTEIC students from Fall 2023 returning in Fall 2024, showing a retention rate of 63.9%.
 - 2,352 or 12.5% are concurrently enrolled in high school.
- ❖ Student headcounts increased by 1,055, or +5.9%, over Fall 2023.

Enrollment Pattern Highlights

- The total credit course enrollment is 53,696 generating 169,275 bill hours, or 5,642.5 FTEs.
- The total bill hours increased by 9,654, or +6.0%, from Fall 2023.
- 65.2% attend part-time; 34.8% attend full-time.
- 54.6% enrolled in at least one distance learning course.
- Average credit load per student remains unchanged at 9.0.

Demographic Highlights

- The average age remains unchanged at 23.1.
- 55.3% are female: 44.5% are male.
- Hispanic students are the largest race/ethnic group with 29.9%, followed by Black students (24.0%), White students (18.6%), and Asian students (12.5%).
- Almost one in five students is a Hispanic female.

Highlights of Selective Student Groups

- There are 2,435 recent Montgomery County Public School (MCPS) graduates enrolled at the College in Fall 2024. This is an increase of 42 students, or +1.8%, over Fall 2023.
- F-1 Visa student enrollment increased by 31, or 6.8%, over Fall 2023.
