The event featured several honored guests, including Councilmember Will Jawando, Dawn Lanzalotti Luedtke, Delegate Ryan Spiegel, Councilmember Laurie-Anne Sayles, and Councilmember Sidney Katz, who helped distribute food to our local community. Some of our members had the opportunity to meet and interact with these local leaders during the event.

Lunch & Learn: Empowering Entrepreneurs in Montgomery County

On November 18th, MCRPA members had the opportunity to attend an insightful Lunch & Learn event featuring Kim Jones, Executive Director of the Montgomery County Black Collective.

The session provided attendees with valuable information about resources and programs available to entrepreneurs in Montgomery County, including the AMBER Business Coaching program, business coaching opportunities, and other initiatives designed to support sustainable business growth.

A standout topic of the event was the AM-BER Business Coaching program, a flag-

ship initiative by the Montgomery County Black Collective. This program offers technical assistance, individualized coaching, and subject matter expertise to small and minority-owned businesses. Key features of the program include weekly management strategies to enhance business operations, monthly group mindfulness sessions aimed at promoting sustainable growth and best practices, and a collaborative entrepreneurial ecosystem fostering continuous learning and development.

In partnership with the Montgomery County Government and other business advancement organizations, the AMBER program focuses on empowering its Fel-

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lows to build stronger, more sustainable organizations. Through a mix of tailored coaching, strategic accountability, and measurable performance indicators, it equips participants with the tools they need to thrive in competitive markets.

The Montgomery County Black Collective is committed to raising awareness, fostering active engagement, and advocating for equitable access to resources addressing racial equity and social justice in the realms of business and capital development.

Kim Jones is a co-founder and Executive Director of the Montgomery County Black Collective. In addition to her work with the Collective, Kim serves as Adjunct Faculty at Montgomery College, where she leads initiatives for the Nonprofit Training Institute. Her prior role as CEO of the Nonprofit Village saw her designing capacity-building and shared service programs to support charitable organizations.

Kim holds a B.A. from Spelman College and is a Licensed Consultant for the National Standards for Excellence. Her professional credentials include certification as a proposal writer and Governance Educator through BoardSource, further underscoring her dedication to excellence and leadership in the nonprofit and business sectors.
