certifications essential for success in diverse child
care settings, spanning infancy to age eight.

## Completion of our program will help you:

- Fulfill the class hours required by Maryland
   State Department of Education (MSDE) to work
   in a Maryland child care setting
- Meet the Child Development Associate (CDA)
   Credential requirement of 120 class hours in a child care setting
- Create your professional portfolio, required for the CDA Credential

## To qualify for our program, applicants must:

- Have at least a high school diploma or equivalent
- Be a Maryland resident
- Be eligible to work in the U.S.
- Meet CASAS English Proficiency requirements
- Have a genuine interest in child care
- Want to improve their English skills
